



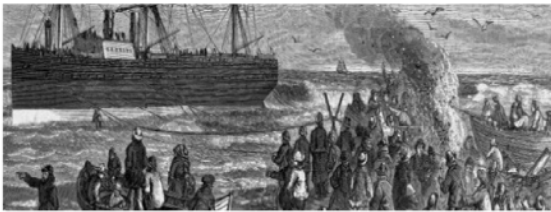

Bringhurst, like many Americans in the late 19th/early 20th century, became enamored with the country's past and in particular the colonial era.
